Mike McElwain graduated from Whiteland Community High School in 1969. He played football, basketball and track while a student at the high school. He graduated from Indiana Law Enforcement Academy and served 43 years with the Johnson County Sheriff's Department retiring with the rank of Lieutenant. Donna Esteb McElwain graduated from Whiteland Community High School in 1971. She was a member of the marching band. She graduated from Indiana Central College (now University of Indianapolis) with a major in nursing. She worked as a registered nurse for over 40 years at Riley and St. Vincent hospitals.

Donna said, "We are both proud to be associated with the Whiteland Community High School Alumni Association. We are very grateful for the opportunities that were given to us while students at WCHS and wish to provide scholarships to students pursuing a career in Law Enforcement, Criminal Justice or Nursing."

The McElwains are taking over one of the 6 Pathways to the Future Scholarships given out each year by The Clark-Pleasant Education Foundation. These are \$1,000 a year for 4 years renewable scholarships. Currently, the Doub Family and Jerry Lasiter have named scholarships with the Pathways Scholarships as well. Last day to sign up to guarantee you receive a Fit at the Farm T-shirt is Monday, September 16.


