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# NEW HAVEMAN FAMILY AGRICULTURAL SCHOLARSHIP ANNOUNCEDI



Glenn and Becky Haveman, alumni of Ohio State University, grew up on farms and studied agronomy and nursing respectively in college. They dreamed of owning a farm and were delighted when the Whiteland Orchard went up for sale in 1975.

The Haveman family owned and operated the Whiteland Orchard on Graham Road for 45 years. They have five children, Timothy, Mark, Jeremy, John and Rachel, who helped out on the farm and attended Clark-Pleasant Community Schools.

When the Havemans retired and sold the orchard, they wanted to continue to help the community. According to the Havemans, "We see a real need for future generations to go into farming or the agricultural field."

In order to encourage students to go into agriculture, the Havemans have started the Haveman Family Agricultural Scholarship that will be

maintained by the Clark-Pleasant Education Foundation. The Class of 2025 will have the first recipient of this scholarship. Students considered for this scholarship should be interested in a career in agriculture. This could be anything from farming to ag mechanics, ag education, horticulture, animal husbandry or something related to food production and more. "We see a great need to grow or at least maintain our agricultural segment of land in our country and maintain the agricultural segment of our population. We need people to grow fruits and vegetables as well as livestock and grains. We need educators who can teach where our food comes from starting in kindergarten all the way through college. Our population is growing, which means our need for food production is growing as well," said the Havemans.

Students applying for this scholarship must major in a field of agriculture, have participated in 4H and/or FFA and should demonstrate financial need. The application for this scholarship is now open and can be found on the Clark-Pleasant Education Foundation website.

# GRANT DOLLARS MAKING A DIFFERENCE

#### CPEF GRANT DOLLARS AT WORK

A huge thank you goes to Clark-Pleasant Education Foundation for funding the cause-and-effect activities during the Fall 2024 cycle. Christmas came early to the Clark-Pleasant Early Learning Center this week. Fulfilling this grant has allowed us to support 240 plus students of varying backgrounds and abilities. We currently have 17 different home languages represented in our program and 124 students and incresing access to resource support. We received our cause-and-effect activities and have put them to good use. Students in all areas of our program have been blessed with new learning tools. We have used the 800 dollars awarded to add new items to our waiting area, evaluation room, therapist areas, resource room and each classroom teacher was given the opportunity to choose new items for their students, while also receiving new puzzles and bubble makers.

In just the short time we have had these new items we have seen an increase in communication, cooperation, determination and pure joy from our current students, evaluated students and visiting children in our lobby. While visiting a classroom one of the teachers was using the bubble maker during circle time. A student who is typically very quiet was jumping up and down smiling, isolating their pointer finger and was saying Pop! Pop! Pop! In another classroom I noticed a student and peer turn taking on their own as they were adding shapes to the shape sorter one at a time. The learning tools are already making an impact! We appreciate your support of our youngest Warrior learners!
